

Aussie Bingo

Students are given a blank BINGO sheet and fill it with terms that they think the teacher will present in an introductory presentation to Australia. As students watch and listen to the presentation, they check off the terms in their boxes. When they have “covered” their card, they can say “bingo!”

Students may be given categories from which to select terms or can randomly determine them. The BINGO card may be three, four, or five squares and with or without a blank center square. This strategy may be adapted to other countries, regions, or topics.
